Rangers travelled south to play South Shore at Collins Park, On paper a tricky fixture as they have already held title elite Foxhall to a goalless draw at Fishers. After last emphatic win against Clifton this was going to be a test, Rangers have a good record against the host.

**Team News;** Ryan Matthews trained this week after a long injury/ban but was not fit enough to take part in the game; hopefully he will be ok next week against Fleetwood. James Wilson (goalie still recovering from an operation to his shoulder) Marshall Maggs with an elbow injury.

The warm up went well with Rangers knowing that a win would lift them in to 3<sup>rd</sup> place while other teams where involved in cup action.

Shore started brightly and soon tested keeper Victor Porter with a low shot into the bottom corner but Porter was equally as good as the effort and saved admirably, Jack Newsham was first for Rangers when he tried a 20yarder which whistled past the post, moments later Newsham again was the provider with an inch perfect cross for Ben Duffield to leap at the far post only to see his header saved by the home keeper.

Duffield made no mistake on 23mins when **GOAL ACTION** he pounced on a Scott Anderson effort where he was denied by the keeper only for the rebound to fall to Duffield who made no mistake slotting into the bottom corner. (0-1) Rangers started to dominate and were creating chances for fun with Newsham and Peter Rumley the providers for strike duo Scott Anderson and Ben Duffield who ran the Shore defence ragged. Matthew Berry threaded a ball to Rumley whose pace outstripped his defender to lash a powerful shot across goal but no one was there to pounce, Duffield again found himself through on goal but squandered a good chance. **GOAL ACTION** on 32 mins when Duffield this time made no mistake heading home from a pin point corner from Berry(0-2)

Shore nearly pulled one back when a 20 yard effort rattled Porters bar with him beat **GOAL ACTION** the clearance went straight to Paul Evans who played in Berry who in turn fed Rumley to race onto and lash home Rangers third. Moments later **GOAL ACTION** again when Berry latched onto a ball at the edge of the box to smash home just before the break. Ht 0-4

Faultless display from Rangers probably the best 40 mins of football seen all season, now it had to be continued ,otherwise lack of concentration levels and sloppiness could lead to Shore getting back into it. Rangers made changes with Paul Stoney, Lee Brambles replacing the injured Jack Newsham and the exhausted Alex Dunkerley who both was just short of magnificent in the first half.

**GOAL ACTION** on 51 mins when Sam Witter upended his marker in the box Shore stepped up to smash home past the helpless Porter. (1-4) It got sticky for a while for Rangers as Shore up the tempo and had Rangers on the back foot for a while and nearly got a second but Porter plucked it out of the air. Duffield again was a menace and was brought down just outside the box, Paul Evans stepped up and fired just over.

**GOAL ACTION** on 59 mins this time Mike Smith who was fantastic all afternoon flights a free kick over to the far post and Duffield was on hand to smash home Rangers fifth and Duffield hat trick for the second week running. (1-5) Cant believe it Rangers gave themselves breathing space and then go and concede straight away 2 mins later **GOAL ACTION** for Shore as they capitalise on slack marking. Ryan Williams replaced the hard working Anderson **GOAL ACTION** again when ace marksman Duffield rattles in his fourth and Rangers sixth to totally demoralise Shore. James Wilson came on for the ten replacing man mountain Alex Bethell, just before the end Rangers was in **GOAL ACTION** again when Ryan Williams whipped din a ferocious corner to find the head of Berry who glanced home past the keeper. ft 2-7

Summary; Fantastic was the only way to describe Rangers first half Professional the second. In a game where you so some of the best football played at junior level and some of the best clinical finishing also. Shore made it tough but the passion and desire from Rangers would have given any one a good game on this performance.
